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Personal Destiny

Question:

Why don't I know why I am here? This total lack of knowledge remains ever-present, despite all the enlightened ones answering me in platitudes.

And don't tell me in the generic sense, as to why humanity is here. I want to know for myself. Why am I here?

Answer:

It is an excellent question. You might want to ask your future self, because it plays a huge role in this thing called personal destiny. There is human destiny and there is personal destiny. There is even group destiny like a family, social group or shared belief. Destiny presumes a future that is preordained by some outside force, be it God or a demigod. It certainly isn't us. Is it?

Do we write our personal destiny? Do we influence the destiny of our family, our social groups, even the infinite spacetime of beliefs? Do we have a tiny, tiny influence on our species as a whole? What about the definitive One and All? If the One and All exists, then itself is the answer. Our destiny is to be a lens for the One and All in all dimensions of spacetime.

How we do that at a personal level is defined by our future self, the part of us that lives outside of spacetime. I am only calling it our Future Self because it is. It is also our past self and our present self. It is the fractal of One and All living in the infinite duality of spacetime, and it is always us. Everyone's destiny is generally the same: To understand these simple yet profound beliefs. That we are a lens of One and All in spacetime, and our destiny is simply that.
